SCANTIC RIVER GREENWAY UPDATES – Rex Joffray, President

The Greenway trail system has begun! This September we completed Section 1 of the Greenway at the Scantic Recreation Park in Scitico. Eagle Scout Nick Caruso led a great Eagle project building and installing a trailhead information kiosk, trail head signs and a bench along the river. The SRWA marked the trail with the State designated yellow markers and created GIS maps. Woodworker Chuck Vernon installed two bridges over streams on the Keeney Mill trail. The trail is in great shape and is now maintained with the new equipment we purchased from the 2008 Greenway grant award. We are seeing daily activity on the trails! Section 2 of the Greenway at 464 Hazard Avenue is underway. The State DEP has put up a parking lot and soon a park sign at the entrance. SRWA volunteers have installed trailhead signs, GIS maps and yellow trail markers in November. This is a beautiful section of the river with gentle rapids, sweeping vistas and a good hike along the river with views of grazing cattle at the Stockers farm across the river. This spring we were awarded a 2009 Greenway designation from the South Maple Street Bridge in Enfield to the town line in East Windsor. I call this section the "Enfield Outback" due to there is little sign of civilization along a heavily wooded and protected river bank. This spring we are working with the Town of East Windsor and the American Heritage Rivers Commission for a 2010 Greenway extension in East Windsor. EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

Kirsten Martin led a group of volunteers this November in the annual Wadeable Stream event setting up a mobile laboratory in the Powder Hollow section off of South Maple Street. The group collected macro invertebrates and cataloged them for identification of water quality. The results remain to be positive from the samplings. Kirsten and Judith Snyder are putting together and educational program they plan on presenting to the local schools and community. They have also given the scholarship materials to the local high school guidance offices and hope to hear back sometime in April.

WATERSHED ADVOCACY

The SRWA, in partnership with the Enfield Conservation Commission and concerned local citizens, were in opposition to the proposed *Villages along the Scantic* housing development. Over 35 houses would have been built above the Scantic in an area that is extremely prone to erosion from terraced escarpments. Already, the Town of Enfield has paid out over 1.5 million dollars in terraced escarpment repairs with more repairs in the works. The application went through a very rigorous process in the Inland Wetlands meetings and then was unanimously voted down 7-0 by the Planning and Zoning Commission
